The findings included in these cross-tabulations are based on a total of 635 submissions among adults aged 18 years and older, residing in the United States. Responses were collected from 15-16 July 2022. Weights were applied at the close of data collection to replicate the distribution of age group and gender in the US population. The population distributions for targeted weighting (the adjusting variables) were obtained through the US Census. Respondents completed the survey on the Premise application. Notably the results from the question "Which Democrat would be your preferred candidate in 2024?" include additional sampling among self-identified Democrats in a second poll to be able to report preferences among those who said Biden "should not" run again. Margin of Error for a sample this size (635) is approximately plus/minus 5%, with 95% confidence level, which means any margin within 10% is statistically unable to to conclude who is ahead or behind, ie, a dead heat.
